Child Friendly: Can I explain what the writer is hinting at/ giving clues about?

Key questions:

- What does this picture tell us about *the wolf*?
- How did ___ feel? How do you know this?
- Why did ___ feel / think ___?
- Why is ___ important?
- Comment on a quotation
- Describe X's reaction / feeling towards his sister?
- Explain...
- Match feelings / thoughts to parts of the story
- Agree or disagree with an opinion. Justify.
- How do we know that X is jealous?
- What does this tell us about how ___ is feeling / thinking?
- How did Lyddie know the others had reached safety?
- What words tell us the writer of this letter is a child?
- What does the word 'plush' imply about the owner of the house?
- What ideas are we given about fox hunting in this article?
- What does the author think about the Roman army?
- How was the atmosphere in the home different before and after this moment?
- Why is the *ladder* important in the story?
- Describe in your own words what happened to John and why he behaved in the way he did?

In all AF3 questions, ask children to support their answer with evidence/clues from the text, e.g. I know John felt like this because in the first chapter it tells us that he
