



## Key Vocabulary and Definitions

1	<b><u>Worship</u></b>	A private or public display of emotion used to communicate with God.
2	<b><u>Baptism</u></b>	Baptism is a ceremony that symbolises a commitment to living a life as a Christian. Holy water is put on a person being baptised by a church leader as a symbol of being cleansed and made ready for a new life for God.
3	<b><u>Holy Communion</u></b>	Christians have a special 'meal to do just what Jesus did. They break bread to remember his body (death) and drink juice/wine to remember his blood. Christians remember that Jesus died for them and forgave them.
4	<b><u>Eucharist</u></b>	Another word for the ceremony of the Holy Communion.
5	<b><u>The Last Supper</u></b>	The final meal that Jesus shared with his disciples before his death.
6	<b><u>Commandment</u></b>	The rules given by God that are mentioned in the Bible.

## Key facts

- 1 Religions have their own special places where people can go to worship. Christians go to a church.
- 2 John the Baptist is an important figure in the Bible. John the Baptist was Jesus' cousin and understood Jesus' special purpose on Earth. This is why he baptised him in the River Jordan.
- 3 Christians choose to have a special meal to do what Jesus did. They break the bread to remember his body and drink juice/wine to remember his blood.
- 4 At the end of the Lord's Supper Christians have remembered that Jesus died for them and forgave them and loves them.
- 5 Worship changes according to the type of church. Evangelical worship is joyous and lively yet Quakers worship is silent and thoughtful.
